IT'S OUR 21ST ANNIVERSARY, SO HERE'S A "SNEAK BEAK" AT OUR TOP 21 WAYS TO RAISE FUNDS

Make and bake

Get crafty or whip up some tasty treats in the kitchen.

BAKE SALE: make cakes, cookies and other goodies to sell at your workplace, school or community group.

BAKE-OFF: organise a baking competition in your workplace. Charge a small fee for entry and give prizes for the best owl-themed bakes. Then hold a bake sale!

KNIT AND CROCHET: make and sell owl characters or hold a knit-a-thon with your crafty friends.

RECIPE BOOK: collect your friends' favourite recipes and make a recipe book to sell.

HOST WITH THE MOST! Hold a curry night, cream tea or cocktail party. Ask your friends and family for a donation to attend the hottest event in town!

PLANT SALE: plant seeds and sell the seedlings to loved ones, at your workplace or a car boot.

Outdoor activities

Make the most of long, sunny summer days.

ask for sponsorship to complete the trail and "collect" every single owl. You could even set a time limit for a race against the clock or challenge yourself to do it in the wackiest way possible! The first 1,000 to complete the trail and raise £21 sponsorship will get their very own medal.

CAR "HOOT" SALE: clear out those unwanted belongings and pop along to your local car boot to raise some funds.

THE BIG KICK: hold a community five-aside tournament. Pay to play or watch – and get the kids involved for a "Little Kick"!

HOLD A SPONSORED NOCTURNAL WALK OR SLEEP OUT. Embrace your inner owl and get outdoors for a night-time challenge.

WALK OR RUN – in an owl mask! Run a marathon, hike the hills – but don your owl mask for the duration and ask for sponsorship.

Indoor activities

For when the weather's not on your side!

GAMES NIGHT: put on a gaming party and challenge your friends to an evening of Playstation or Xbox fun. Charge for entry or ask for sponsorship for continuous gaming!

BINGO: host a bingo night – you could even ask local businesses to donate prizes.

READ-A-THON: one for the kids!
A sponsorship challenge to read as many books as possible. The Owl and the Pussycat, Harry Potter, The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark...

WISE-OWL QUIZ: test your friends and family's knowledge and hold a quiz. Why not even have a category about owls? Download a question sheet from The Big Hoot website.

BARN OWL DANCE. When Westerns and owls collide! Have a hoot with a hoedown and charge for entry.

HOLDING AN EVENT?

Raise even more funds by adding on raffles, quizzes and opportunities to buy snacks, drinks or other goodies.

GOT YOUR OWN IDEA?

Get creative and come up with your own top fundraisers; the sky's the limit!

Or what about...

DIGITAL DETOX. Great for those who are glued to their phones! Ask for sponsorship to go phone-free for as long as you can.

CAR WASH. Bring a sparkle to your neighbours' or colleagues' cars; grab the sponges and a bucket and ask for a donation for every car cleaned.

WEAR YOUR WINGS TO WORK
(or school!) day Raise funds AND

(or school!) day. Raise funds AND awareness by walking around in beautifully designed wings. You can either ask for sponsorship or club together with friends to pay for the privilege!

GROW £2.10 CHALLENGE: Get the kids to embrace their entrepreneurial spirit. Starting with £2.10, how much money can they make?

GETTING STARTED WITH FUNDRAISING

FOLLOW OUR GUIDE TO ENSURE YOUR FUNDRAISING EFFORTS ARE FUN AND SUCCESSFUL

1. Choose your activity

Pick something from our list or come up with an idea of your own. Then set a time and date for the event.

2. Set your target

Setting a fundraising target is a great way to keep everyone motivated. Decide how much you'd like to raise and how you'll collect donations. JustGiving is a quick and simple way to pay in all your donations and sponsorship, and money is sent directly to Chestnut Tree House.

If you're holding a sponsored event and would like to get sponsors offline, download a sponsor form from The Big Hoot website. Important: please ensure that sponsors tick that they are a UK taxpayer on this form (if applicable), so that we can claim back Gift Aid.

3. Spread the word

Don't be shy – make sure friends and family know about the event and how to donate. If you're using JustGiving, share the link and use its QR codes. If your event is community-wide, contact local media, put up posters and use community social media groups to tell the world! You can download poster templates and social media images from The Big Hoot website.

4. Add up your total

Keep track of donations as you go and remember to encourage the use of Gift Aid for all donations – this can be done by filling out Gift Aid details on sponsorship forms or donors can do it online if you have a JustGiving page.

The easiest way to pay in your hard-earned funds is to set up a JustGiving page, making it easy for everyone to support you. By using JustGiving, your donations are automatically sent to us and can be increased through Gift Aid.

USEFUL INFORMATION

FOLLOW OUR GUIDANCE TO ENSURE YOU STAY SAFE AND REMAIN ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE LAW

Raffles

A raffle is a draw that happens on a single day, with all tickets sold on the day of the draw. Cloakroom tickets can be used for this kind of draw and no licence is required.

Prize Draw Lottery

If you're selling tickets ahead of the day of the draw, this is a Prize Draw Lottery and is governed by the Gambling Act 2005.

You'll need a licence for this kind of draw. Tickets must be printed in advance with the details of the licence, our charity number and details of the draw itself. Please contact thebighoot@chestnut.org.uk if you wish to carry out this kind of draw.

Bucket collections

If you borrow any of our collection buckets and pots it is your responsibility to ensure they are kept safely sealed. Children under the age of 16 are not legally allowed to collect money for charity in a public place, but they can accompany you.

Photographs

You must have the written permission of parents/carers to take or use photos of children under 18.

Risk Assessment

Before holding any event, please carry out a risk assessment. We can provide a template on request.

Gift Aid

We can reclaim up to 25% of every £1 donated to us through Gift Aid. Please encourage your donors to complete a Gift Aid declaration when they donate – or use JustGiving.

Food safety

If you are providing any food, including cakes, please read the Food Standards Agency's guidelines on food safety. These can be found on their website: www.food.gov.uk


